(Note: The following highlights are taken from the minutes of the Monday, October 21, 2024, regular Session meeting.)

B.J. Crownover spoke to Session regarding old documents and photographs from the various churches that have merged to become Providence Presbyterian. She asked if the Session would grant permission to store them on a thumb drive for the Blair County Genealogical Society. Session agreed to allow B.J. to make arrangements with Jennifer Braun to digitize this information.

Clerk's Report: Seventy-eight communicants received communion on World Communion Sunday, October 6.

We received a letter from the Donlan family stating that they have been attending the Zion

Lutheran Church in Hollidaysburg. Rob, Brigitte, Ethan and Hannah Donlan have requested a transfer of their membership to that church. The transfer was approved.

Treasurer's Report: A draft copy of the 2025 church budget was distributed and discussed. The final budget will be voted on at next month's Session meeting.

The date of our congregational meeting was changed to Sunday, November 24, 2024.

Huntingdon Presbytery Report: Pastor Livingston was in attendance at the Presbytery meeting at Upper Spruce Creek church and relayed some of the issues that were being discussed. The next meeting will be held on Saturday, November 2, at 9:00 am. Rick Herbster has tentatively agreed to be our Session representative at that meeting.

Moderator's Report: Pastor Hilary is getting settled in and thanked everyone for their help with her move. She will be taking some time off from Wednesday, November 13, through Sunday, November 17.

She is working on the service for her installation as well as some other special services. She's also getting to know the congregation.

Pastor Livingston suggested that we have name tags for the regular members of the congregation to help visitors get acquainted with us. Session discussed this idea and she will check into the different formats that could be used.

Session Team Reports (Chair)

Finance & Stewardship (Sue Whitsel): Per Capita for 2024 has been established at \$39.24. For the period ending on September 30, 2024, there was \$3,717.82 paid into the per capita fund, which is unchanged from last month's amount.

The Presbytery of Huntingdon at its September 24, 2024, meeting, approved a per capita rate for 2025 of \$27.76 for the Presbytery, \$2.40 for the Synod of the Trinity, and \$10.84 for the General Assembly—a total of \$41.00 per member. This represents a 4.5% increase from the 2024 rate.

Materials for the 2025 stewardship program have been mailed or distributed at the church. Those

pledging to the church have been instructed to return their Estimate of Giving cards on or before Stewardship Sunday, November 10, 2024. Pastor Livingston delivered a stewardship sermon, "Wealth and God's Kingdom," in October.

Congregational Care (Gail Irwin): Coupons will be mailed to the Yokosuka Naval Base in Japan on Monday, October 28. Our thanks to all the faithful "clippers" who contin ue to support this project.

The schedule for Cards/Flowers/Transportation was updated for the months of October and November.

Charyl Gardner organized the delivery of homemade cakes from our congregation to the Presbyterian Village at Hollidaysburg for Friday, September 27. A new schedule for 2025 will be posted soon. Penny Rupeka, the events coordinator at the Presbyterian Village, stated that this project has been well received by the residents of the Village.

The next cycle of communion for the home-bound is scheduled for November. Pastor Hilary will set up the November schedule and coordinate with members of the committee who are available to accompany her.

Birthday cards, get-well cards, and missing-you cards were prepared by team members for October. Names for the congregation card shower were designated.

The committee assembled and delivered "Thinking of You" treat bags for congregants whom we haven't seen in a while or who may just need a cheerful greeting. **Congregational Fellowship (Glenn Nelson):** There will be no coffee fellowship on the morning of Sunday, November 3. Instead, there will be light refreshments served following the installation service of Pastor Livingston on that same day. The service starts at 3:00 pm.

The Advent Dinner will be held on Sunday, December 8, immediately following the morning worship service. Glenn will contact John Gallace regarding the dinner menu.

Containers that have been stored in the basement kitchen cabinets will be moved to the upstairs storage room and may be used by any team.

Mission (Judy Hartzell) : The application for the Hunger Fund has been requested from Huntingdon Presbytery and should be completed for the next Session meeting in November.

Thirty-six guests were served with the help of 11 volunteers at the September Soup on Saturday event. We delivered leftover meatballs, two cakes, and rolls and donuts to the Family Services Teen Shelter in Altoona.

October Mission donations: Altoona Food Bank -\$300; Altoona Teen Shelter - \$300.

Our Peace and Global Witness special offering ended on World Communion Sunday, October 6. The total collected was \$475.00, of which, our church received \$68.75. Fifty-percent of this offering will go to Presbytery Disaster Assistance for help with the recent storms in the U.S.

The Soup on Saturday event in October was served to 24 participants. In November, the menu calls for sloppy joes, soup, fruit, desserts and beverages. Providence youth will set up a cookie decorating table to provide desserts for the December SOS.

This month's mission giving includes Altoona Food Bank, Mountain Lion Backpack, and families united for change.

Community donations for November: Altoona Food Bank - we are asking for donations of instant mashed potatoes, stuffing and canned gravy or gravy mix packets. Any non-perishable food is always appreciated. For our Food Pantry, we are asking for donations of any non-perishable food items and personal care items. No glass containers, please.

Outreach (Jane Yerty): Our committee reviewed the clothing giveaway and made final plans for the Veterans Day card-making event.

The Community Garden will be closing at the end of October. The team is planning a workday on Tuesday, October 22, at 8:00 am with a rain date set for Saturday, October 26, at 8:00 am. Our Community Library will also be closing at the end of October, but books are always available for any group to give away.

The Outreach Team also felt there is a need for something to follow-up with visitors and asked Session for some input. Several ideas were discussed and Session decided to bring back the Covenant of Fellowship folders to sign in. We will start using them in November.

Spiritual Enhancement (Jeanie Mollica): JB Tree Farm was a successful event with 35 participants. We had new youth join us and we are hopeful that they return.

Sunday school, Junior Church and the new youth video sessions are going well. The Junior/Senior High Sunday School class has had the highest attendance level it has seen in the last two years. They are also enjoying the new video session during the morning worship service and are watching episodes of "The Chosen" followed by discussions.

All teachers have reported liking the new curriculum choices. We would like a television monitor to be added to the new elementary Sunday school/Junior Church room which would be used with the curriculum. Rick Herbster knows a person that could donate a monitor and he will advise him of our interest.

Upcoming events: November - Gratitude Games Night, with pizza, games, and being thankful for each other. December - Running a hot chocolate and cookie decorating bar during Soup on Saturday on December 21.

Worship (Rick Herbster): Acolytes, ushers and liturgists are set for October.

The Worship Team budget (\$4,100.00) was completed and submitted for approval. The team

is also recommending the formation of an "A/V Task Force" which Rick Herbster will lead.

Pastor Hilary discussed plans for her Sunday, November 3, installation service.

The possibility of using a different poinsettia supplier (in lieu of Kerr Creations) was discussed. Members of the team will check with The Growing Thing in Greenwood and with Piney Creek in Martinsburg.

Pastor Livingston will develop appropriate liturgy for Reformation Sunday on October 27. Carole Parsons will demonstrate the pipe organ's zimbelstern and provide information for the worship bulletin.

Our pastor will also develop appropriate liturgy for All Saints Day observance on November 3. Inserts will be included in the November 3 bulletin for members to write the names of loved ones (who have passed away in the past year) to be remembered. Pastor Hilary will also include information in our worship service bulletins before this date to introduce this remembrance process.

Advent and Christmas traditions at Providence were discussed—planning will continue at the Wednesday, November 6, Worship Team meeting.
